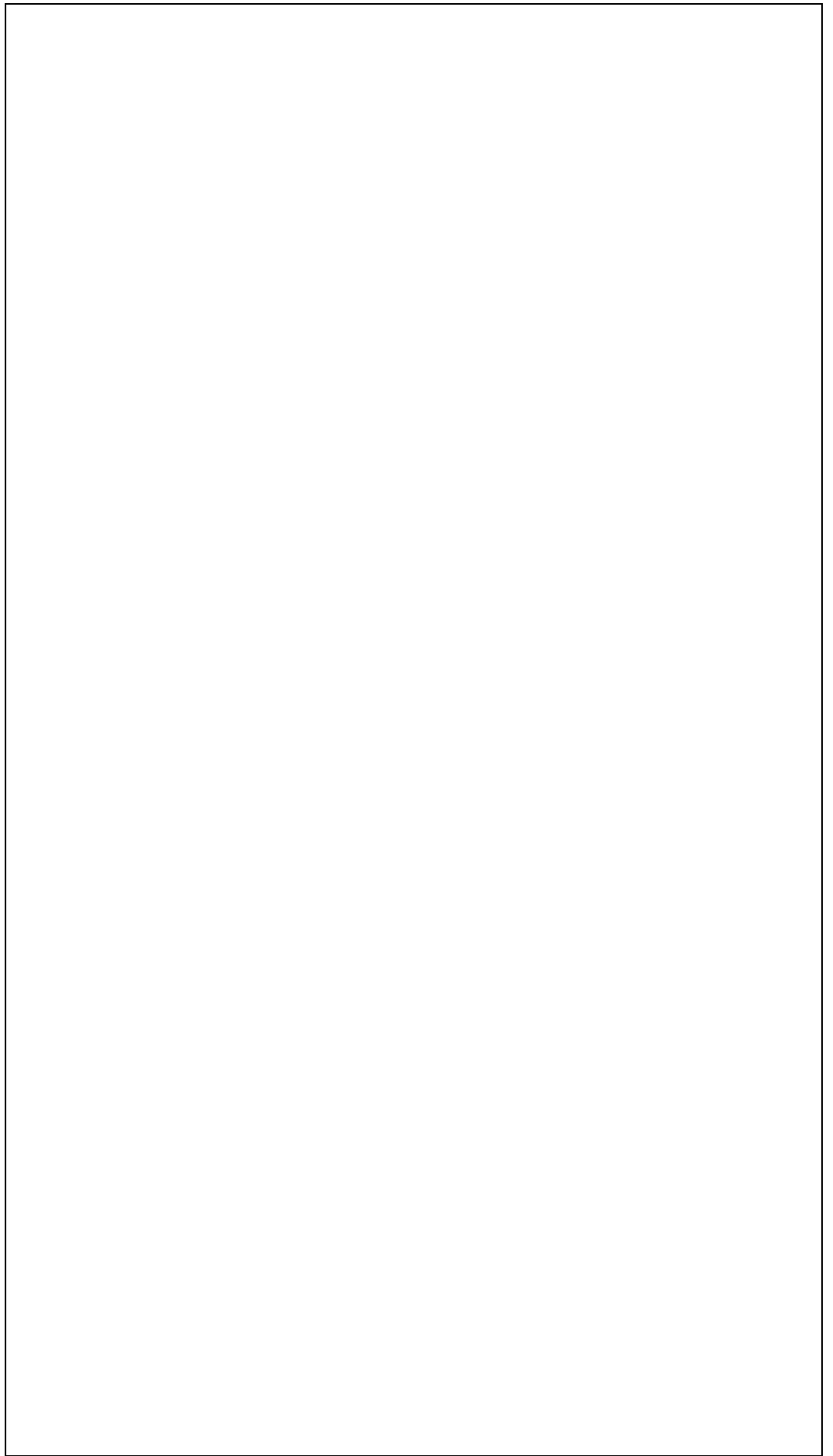

In practice this is done by providing a safe home and education to Kenyan orphans with the longer term objective of enabling the young person to become independent once they have left formal education and go out into the workplace.

The Trust funds the Kanyawegi Children's Home in the Ontonglo district of Kenya.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During the year, donations of £44,702 (previous year £39,972) were received, and £42,709 was spent running the Home (previous year equivalent £42,593).

The year finished with overall cash funds of £2240 (previous year £247).

The year was marked by the transition of the Home from its original site in the Otonglo district to rented accommodation in a nearby community called Riat. Everything possible was done to maintain stability in the education programmes of the children and young people supported and to ensure safe transition to the new site for those still linked to the Kanyawegi Home. The charity is indebted to the staff of the Home who worked hard to make the transition as smooth as possible, and particularly to the Home's manager who oversaw all the arrangements.

It was during this year that the name of the children's home was changed to Emmanuel Home.

Consideration is being given to how best use the funds available to support the children and young people, and this has led to some changes in the schools and colleges used for their education.
