The relief of poverty and advancement of education of orphans and children, in particular but not exclusively in Kenya, in accordance with Christian principles. In practice this is done by providing safe accommodation, support and education to Kenyan orphans with the longer term objective of enabling the young person to become independent once they have left formal education and go out into the workplace.

The Trust funded the Kanyawegi Children's Home in the Ontonglo district of Kenya until a road widening scheme forced a move from that site. A new home for the children (called Emmanuel Home) was started in the Riat district.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During the year, donations of £30,758(previous year £31,499) were received, and £31,460 was spent running the Home (previous year equivalent £32325).

The year finished with overall cash funds of £87 (previous year £1064).

The accounting year to 31st May 2017 has been a year of greater stability for the home, in terms of both finance and emotional wellbeing. Although donations are down on the previous year so too are running costs and generally the home is in a more stable condition. Whilst raising donations continues to be a challenge, the home will see significant reductions in outgoings as university fees come to an end and courses finish.

A visit to Kenya by the charity Chairman in January 2017 provided an opportunity to review how the work of Emmanuel Home was going and also led to the establishment of a new 'Kenyan Committee' to oversee the work. Membership included a couple who run a local academy school, who were in a position to offer educational expertise and a degree of 'independent' oversight. The visit was also important for re-emphasising the need for improved financial record keeping in Kenya. Visits to a range of schools gave the opportunity to see how the children and young people were progressing.

The UK Committee of the charity had decided (following the 15/16 financial year) that post-secondary school education at polytechnic or university could no longer be supported. Discussions began as to what alternative short-term training options might be offered in order to provide the young people leaving secondary school with skills and/or qualifications that would increase their chances of acquiring employment.

The charity has received notification of a legacy from which the charity may benefit in due course.

The principal source of funds is from individual sponsors making regular donations to support the Home and/or to sponsor a particular child or young person. This is supplemented by occasional 'one off' gifts from individuals and support from churches. All funds given to the charity are used to support the work of the children's home. A major part of the funding is used to support education programmes from Primary School through to Secondary School and, for a few individuals to College or University. Post-secondary school training options are being considered as an alternative to higher education – due to the high cost of fees.

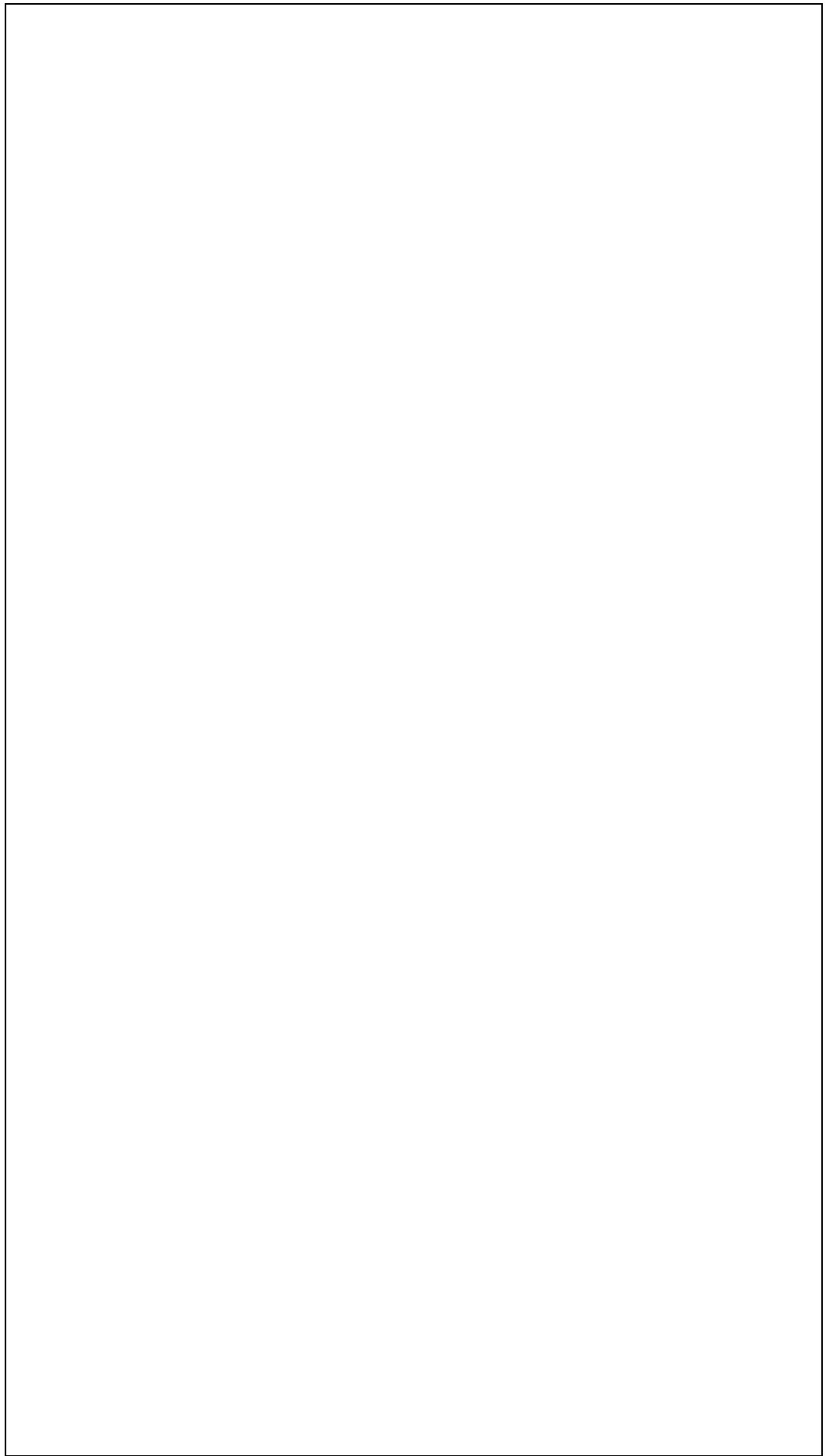
